Mid-States Corridor and the Dubois County Council

To the Editor,

A special Dubois County Council meeting was held on Monday December 29, 2025. The only agenda item was a "presentation" by the Mid-States Corridor RDA's legal counsel, Mr. Bill Kaiser and it's Chairman, Mr. Mark Schroeder. It was unclear what the purpose of the meeting was; but, Mr. Kaiser and Mr. Schroeder spoke for over an hour and forty-five minutes about the RDA, the recent Public Policy Poll and other issues related to the RDA.

Mr. Kaiser noted that the RDA law requires that within 12 to 18 months of the end of the RDA's term, it, the RDA, must be reapproved by the entities involved. He indicated that the law is not clear about the method or the timing. This is a rather disingenuous statement, as the law is very clear. Indiana Code 36-7.6-2-5 provides clear and direct verbiage for continuing or ending an RDA. How can an attorney not understanding the following:

"At least twelve (12) months and not more than eighteen (18) months before the end of a county's, qualified city's, third class city's, or town's membership period under subsection (b) or this subsection, the county, qualified city, third class city, or town described

ACLU of Indiana Files Two Actions Against City of Loogootee for Once Again Attempting to Block PrideFest



Today, the ACLU of Indiana filed two actions against the City of Loogootee arising from its latest ordinance that would prevent the annual PrideFest from taking place in the city's Public Square area, in violation of the First Amendment. The complaints include a new lawsuit and a motion for contempt. A prior ordinance was permanently enjoined as unconstitutional by the U.S. District Court for the Southern Division of Indiana in August 2025. That injunction had allowed PrideFest to continue as planned the following month. Nevertheless, at the end of 2025, Loogootee passed a "new" ordinance that contained much of the same language as the enjoined ordinance, including two provisions that the Court had declared unconstitutional and permanently enjoined. As a result, the ACLU has sought to hold Loogootee in contempt for not obeying the Court's prior orders and has filed a new lawsuit to have the new ordinance declared unconstitutional and enjoined so that Loogootee PrideFest 2026 can proceed as planned. Ken Falk, legal director, ACLU of Indiana, issued the following statement: "Court orders must be complied with, and Loogootee, by enacting an ordinance that contains provisions enjoined by the Court, is in contempt of its lawful orders. Moreover, the ordinance it has adopted continues Loogootee's pattern of attempting to unconstitutionally restrict this celebration of the LGBTQ+ community. We will continue to vigorously defend our client's right to hold the event at their desired location in the heart of Loogootee." To the Editor,

Over 300 INDOT projects have been or are being cancelled or postponed indefinitely due to “funding constraints”. Yet, the billion plus dollar Mid-States Corridor project is not on the list. Why? It appears that INDOT and Gov. Braun are trying get the FHWA to allow the Mid-States Corridor to be a toll road. Gov. Braun has said that he wants to capture dollars from out-of-state vehicles traveling through Indiana that don't fill up at the gas pump, as a reason for the tolling request.

What is going on here? The Mid-States Corridor is being touted as the cure-all in transportation needs. Making Indiana's limited access highways toll roads seems counter intuitive. It's a known fact that if trucker (or most travelers) has to pay a toll, they will find a non-toll route. And, most assuredly, all local traffic will shun a toll road. Dubois, Martin and Daviess counties just don't have the congestion to cause commuters to pay a toll to go to and from work; or, for that matter, to save a few minutes to get to Indianapolis.

Why didn't Mr. Bill Kaiser or Mr. Mark Schroeder disclose these “funding constraints” when they addressed the Dubois County Council? Why hasn't Ms. Kyanna Wheeler, Ms. Nicole Minton, Mr. Jason Dupont or even Mr. Colin Pipenger ever mentioned this? Why has this not appeared on the Mid-States Corridor's web-site or Facebook page; or for that matter, why have the Hoosiers for the Corridor been silent? This does not sound like transparency in government.

The Indiana State Legislature has apparently had enough of the chicanery. INDOT has been and is canceling much needed highway projects all over the state; but, are leaving the



Mid-States Corridor untouched. We all know this is a pet project of the Governor's; and, now so does the rest of the state. Many of us have said that the Mid-States Corridor is a project that will negatively impact the entire state and now the proof is in front of the entire legislature. As the banner on the Washington Post declares "Democracy dies in darkness" and perhaps now the truth about the folly of the Mid-States Corridor will see the light of day.

Tolls may help with on-going maintenance but there are no tolls to pay the billion dollar construction costs. The tolls will not offset the "local" match of over \$100 million that INDOT requires from Dubois County. Don't be fooled, the people of Martin and Daviess counties are not willing or able to pay a \$100 million local match. It get's lost that the Mid-States Corridor is a multi-county project. The Martin County Commissioners and Council have stated they are opposed; and, they are not members of the Mid-States

Corridor RDA. The stated cost of \$1 billion is only for the 21 miles in Dubois County. The Corridor from I-64 to I-69 is 54 miles long with about 22 miles in Martin County. It's disingenuous for INDOT and the RDA to continue to say the cost of the Corridor will be about \$1 billion without also saying there is at least another billion dollar cost through Martin and Daviess counties. What are the cost and time savings if the Corridor were to end at Haysville?

The opposition to the Mid-States Corridor is

growing state-wide, it's no longer just a few here in Dubois, Martin and Daviess county that are opposed. The list of State legislatures who are now opposed to the Mid-States Corridor is growing; and they are publicly stating their opposition. It's way past time, as the recent poll indicated, for our local politicians to take a stand. It's no longer acceptable to be a Mug-Wump on the fence. The public demands to know their representatives position, so they can decide whether or not to support them in the up-coming elections.

LOOGOOTEE BOYS BASKETBALL ADVANCES TO THE SEMIFINALS OF THE GREENE COUNTY INVITATIONAL



The boys varsity basketball team traveled North to WRV tonight to take on Pleasantview Christian in the opening round for the Greene County Invitational. The Lions came home with a 50-32 victory and advanced to the semifinals on Friday night where they will take on Shakamak at 6PM. The Lakers were victorious over Dugger Union. The Lions led 13-11 at the end of the first quarter, but the pesky Bulldogs used a late three to tie it before the break at 21 all. The Lions held the Bulldogs to just three points in the third quarter and led 34-24 heading to the 4th. In the 4th quarter, they again kept

up solid defense and led by as much as 50-26 before reserves finished it off. "Hats off to those kids," said Coach Thompson of the Pleasantview team. "They play extremely hard, maybe harder than anyone we've played all year. Trenton Graber is a load and could play for a ton of teams in the area," stated Coach Thompson. Graber led the Bulldogs with 13 points and 8 rebounds. Junior Will Lyon led the Lions with 18 points. Senior back-court mate AJ Foster added 17 for the Lions and Senior forward Christian Garcia joined them in double figures with 11. Seth Salmon and Noah Hager rounded out the Lion scoring with two apiece. The Lions moved to 10-3 on the season. The Greene County Invitational continues on Wednesday

night with WRV vs. Pike Central and Evansville Day vs. Shoals.

Alaina Diamond Nears Top 10 All-Time Scorers, AJ Foster Approaching 1000 Points

Jack Fellers recorded an assist from Wyatt Street during the game. A number of Lions are approaching significant milestones in the history of Lion basketball. Alaina Diamond, a junior at LHS, scored 24 points in Monday night's victory, bringing her unofficial career total to 763 points. This places her within 43 points of entering the top 10 all-time Lady Lion scorers. If she remains healthy, Diamond is expected to surpass the late Diane Kiefner's record within the next few games. 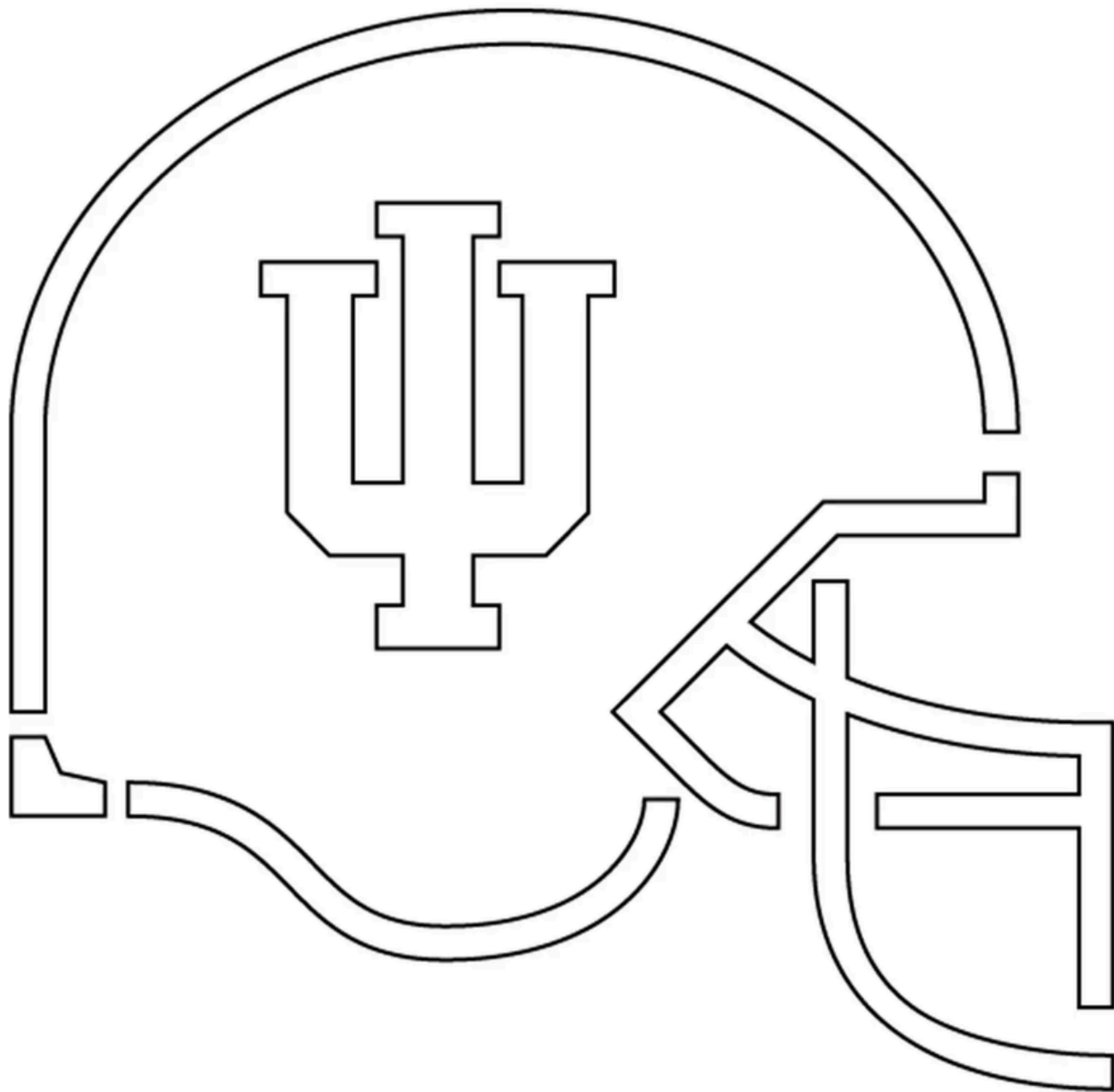
